## PROCHITURE FOR BALLOTTNG IN THE GHNERAL ASSHMBLY

In accerdance with Rule 73 of the Provisional Rules of Procedure for the General Assembly, all decisions relating to temure of offioe shali be taiken by secret bailot.

The belloting procedure in plenery meetings of the Genereil Assembly will be as follows:-

1. The President will anounce that, in oonformity with the. Rules of Procedure, the deaiston on the item on the agende in question will be taken by seoret ballot. Fech member of the General Assembly has one rote.
2. The Preaident ahall then appoint two representatitoe to act as tellers, and shall invite them tog take their place at the rostrum. Two members of the Seoretarlat will then be appointed by the Rreautive Secretary to essiat the tellers.
3. The ballot-box will be placedo on the rostrum by the Executive Secretary.
4. The tellers will verify the fact that the beillotionax is empty, look it, and return the key to the Executive secretaiy. 5. The prineipal representetives of each member shall write on the ballot paper provided the name or names of the oandidate or candidates he wighes to support, or, if he wishes to abstain from voting, shali write the word "Abstention." Any bellot paper conteining more names than there are places to be filled Or any written observation other than the name of the candidate or andidates preferred shall be invalid.
5. The Executive secretary shell then read the names of the membera of the Generel Assembly, in acoordance with Rule 71 , which provides that roll-calis shall be taken in English alphabetical order. As the roll-asil ia celled, the

principal representative of each member will proceed to the rostrum and deposit his ballot paper in the ballot-box.
7. The President shall, at the conclusion of the roll-call declare the belloting closed.
8. The Executive Seoretary will then unlock the ballot-box and the tellers shall, with the assistance of two members of the Secretariat, specially dasignated Por this purpose, proceod to count the votes. The result of this aount will be recorided and acymunicated at once to the president.
9. The President will then announce the result of the
voting as follows :
Number of members voting
Number of valid ballots
Number of abstentions
Number of invalid ballots
Required majority.
He will then accounce the number of votes received by each candidate and declare the election of the candidate or candidates receiving the reguired majority. If no candidate has received the required majority, or if the number of oandidates in miltiple elections is not equal to the number of places to be filled, subsequent ballots will be taken by the same procedure.

This procedure will also apply to balloting in the Committees of the General Assembly.
