PERMANENT MISSIONS TO THE UNITED NATIONS

Report of the Secretary-General

1. The present report is submitted to the General Assembly in pursuance of resolution 257 A (III) of 3 December 1948, which requested the Secretary-General "to submit, at each regular session of the General Assembly, a report on the credentials of the permanent representatives accredited to the United Nations".
2. At the date of the present report, seventy-five Member States have set up permanent missions at the seat of the United Nations, viz.:
