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## Seventy-first session Third Committee

### Organization of the work of the Third Committee

#### Note by the Secretariat

##### Allocation of items

1. The agenda items allocated by the General Assembly to the Third Committee will be issued in document [A/C.3/71/1](#). Background information on those items may be found in the annotations to the agenda (see [A/71/100](#)).

##### Programme of work

2. The draft programme of work (see annex) has been prepared bearing in mind paragraph (b) of rule 99 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, Assembly decision 70/537 on the programme of work of the Third Committee for the seventy-first session, the agenda of the seventy-first session ([A/71/150](#)), the first report of the General Committee on the organization of the seventy-first regular session of the General Assembly, adoption of the agenda and allocation of items ([A/71/250](#)), relevant resolutions and decisions adopted by the Assembly on the rationalization of its work and that of the Third Committee, as well as past experience in the utilization of conference services.

##### Question time and interactive dialogues

3. In accordance with the established practice of the Committee and pursuant to paragraphs 3 (c) and (d) of the annex to General Assembly resolution [58/316](#) on further measures for the revitalization of the work of the General Assembly, immediately following the introduction of reports by executive heads and senior members of the Secretariat at the beginning of each debate, interactive dialogues and a “question time” will be held with heads of departments and offices, representatives of the Secretary-General, special rapporteurs and other special mechanisms as part of the formal proceedings of the Committee. Delegations are invited to participate actively in these dialogues with questions and unscripted comments. The general discussion of each agenda item or cluster of agenda items is to follow the question time.



### **List of speakers**

4. The list of speakers for the general discussion on agenda items allocated to the Third Committee will be opened on Monday, 19 September 2016.

5. Requests for inscription received from permanent missions to the United Nations and observer States for the general discussion on agenda items allocated to the Third Committee will be sent electronically through the e-Speakers system. An automated e-mail acknowledgement will be sent within one hour of receipt of the request for inscription. Requests for inscription received from intergovernmental organizations, entities that have observer status with the General Assembly, the United Nations system, including the funds, programmes, specialized agencies and regional commissions, will be sent by e-mail to the Secretariat.

### **Statements**

6. Statements made during the general discussion under each agenda item or cluster of agenda items will be limited to 5 minutes for individual delegations and to 12 minutes for statements made on behalf of a group of delegations.

7. Under item 68 of the agenda, “Promotion and protection of human rights”, delegations may make one statement under sub-item (a) and one statement under sub-item (d), which are to be discussed sequentially. Under sub-items (b) and (c), which are to be considered jointly, delegations may make two separate statements, one under sub-item (b) and one under sub-item (c). In the interest of time, however, delegations are encouraged to make only one statement under sub-items (a) and (d), and one statement under sub-items (b) and (c), within the established time limit.

8. Under item 66, “Elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance”, and item 67, “Right of peoples to self-determination”, which are to be discussed jointly, delegations may also make two separate statements. Similarly, in the interest of time, delegations are again encouraged to make only one statement within the established time limit.

9. In accordance with previous decisions of the General Assembly, delegations should exercise their right of reply at the end of the day whenever two meetings have been scheduled for the consideration of the relevant agenda item on that day, or at the conclusion of the consideration of the item, if that is sooner. The first statement should be limited to five minutes and the second, if any, to three minutes.

### **List of documents**

10. Attention is drawn to the addendum to the present note ([A/C.3/71/L.1/Add.1](#)), which lists the documentation submitted under each agenda item expected to be allocated to the Third Committee.

### **Conference facilities and meeting arrangements**

11. Unless otherwise specified, official meetings of the Committee will be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 3 to 6 p.m. in Conference Room 1 (Conference Building). The General Assembly has stressed that a punctual start of meetings is critical to the efficient utilization of services allocated to the intergovernmental bodies of the United Nations. In accordance with past practice, it is proposed that

rule 108 of the Committee's rules of procedure be waived with respect to the quorum needed to declare a meeting open.

### **Co-sponsorship of draft resolutions and proposals**

12. The initiation and co-sponsorship of draft resolutions and other proposals will be undertaken electronically through the eSponsorship application without prejudice to the possibility offered to delegations of co-sponsoring a proposal at the time of its introduction or prior to the Committee's action on the latter. To maximize the efficiency of the Committee, however, all delegations wishing to co-sponsor a proposal are invited to do so electronically through the eSponsorship application rather than during the formal proceedings of the Committee.

### **Introduction of draft resolutions and proposals**

13. In line with efforts to further enhance the efficiency of the Committee, main sponsors are urged to limit the introduction of their proposals to statements not exceeding three minutes. Main sponsors are also discouraged from making a formal introductory statement on a draft resolution upon its issuance as an "L" document and are urged to consider instead making only one introductory statement, if any, prior to action on the draft resolution or proposal.

### **Report of the Economic and Social Council**

14. In paragraph 4 (c) of the annex to General Assembly resolution [58/316](#), the Assembly decided that the item entitled "Report of the Economic and Social Council" should be considered in its entirety in plenary meeting. Subsequently, it was clarified that, in implementing that decision, the relevant parts of chapter I of the report of the Council that related to agenda items allocated to the Main Committees would be considered by the Committee concerned, for final action by the Assembly (see [A/59/250/Add.1](#), para. 4).

### **Report of the Human Rights Council**

15. In its resolution [65/281](#), entitled "Review of the Human Rights Council", the General Assembly decided to continue its practice of allocating the item entitled "Report of the Human Rights Council" to the plenary of the Assembly and to the Third Committee, in accordance with its decision 65/503 A, with the understanding that the President of the Council will present the report in her or his capacity as President to the plenary of the Assembly and to the Third Committee and that the Third Committee will hold an interactive dialogue with the President of the Council following the presentation of the report of the Council to the Third Committee.

### **Conclusion of the work of the Committee**

16. Bearing in mind the number of meetings allocated to the Third Committee, a target date of 23 November 2016 has been set for the conclusion of its work. The Committee will, however, endeavour to conclude its work earlier, if possible.
