ADDENDUM

1. By a note dated 3 October 1962 the Permanent Representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics has transmitted to the Secretary-General the following communication:

"The Permanent Mission of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Acting Secretary-General of the United Nations and in reply to United Nations Secretariat letter No. TR 342/4 of 23 May 1962 has the honour to report that 130 students from Non-Self-Governing Territories, including Angola, Basutoland, Portuguese Guinea, Kenya, Mauritius, Nyasaland, Rhodesia, British Guiana, Zanzibar, Uganda and other Territories, are at present studying in the Soviet Union on scholarships provided by the Soviet Union.

"The scholarship-holders are studying at various higher educational establishments in the Soviet Union, among them, the Patrice Lumumba Peoples' Friendship University, which was founded by Soviet public organizations to assist under-developed countries, including Trust and Non-Self-Governing Territories, in training their national cadres. The students qualify as engineers, agronomists, teachers, doctors, economists, etc. The institutes and the Peoples' Friendship University have preparatory departments where courses lasting from one to three years are provided.

"The scholarship-holders are selected from among men and women under thirty-five years of age, irrespective of race, nationality and religion. A/5242/Add.l English Page 2

"The knowledge they acquire satisfies the highest requirements of modern science and technology.

"Travel expenses and costs of tuition, stipends and medical care, as well as dormitory fees, are defrayed by the Soviet Union.

"The Permanent Mission requests that this information be included in the Secretary-General's report to the seventeenth session of the General Assembly on offers by Member States of study and training facilities for inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories."
