QUESTION OF SOUTH WEST AFRICA

Letter dated 5 March 1962 from the President of the General
Assembly addressed to the Secretary-General

At the sixteenth session, the General Assembly decided, by operative paragraph 2 of resolution 1702 (XVI) adopted on 19 December 1961, to establish a United Nations Special Committee for South West Africa, consisting of seven Member States nominated by the President of the General Assembly.

Pursuant to that resolution, I hereby decide to nominate the following seven Member States to be members of the United Nations Special Committee for South West Africa: Brazil, Burma, Mexico, Norway, Philippines, Somalia and Togo.

I should be grateful if you would arrange for this decision to be communicated to the countries concerned and to all Members of the United Nations.
