pressure, others will not. And while any human weakness can be forgiven, the fact remains that duress cannot excuse a physician's breach of the obligations inherent in his profession.

- 18. In the form proposed, the second sentence of principle VI is dangerous because it will constitute a kind of justification for the actions of torturers, or will certainly be invoked as such by the latter.
- 19. It is for Governments to ensure that physicians and other health personnel are never compelled to act contrary to the principles of medical ethnics.
- 20. The principle that there shall be no derogation (without anything further being said) therefore seems preferable.
