REQUEST FOR THE INCLUSION OF A SUPPLEMENTARY ITEM
IN THE AGENDA OF THE NINETEENTH SESSION

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON THE THIRD UNITED NATIONS INTERNATIONAL
CONFERENCE ON THE PEACEFUL USES OF ATOMIC ENERGY

Note by the Secretary-General

The Secretary-General has the honour to request, under rule 14 of the rules of procedure, the inclusion of the following supplementary item in the agenda of the nineteenth regular session of the General Assembly:

"Report of the Secretary-General on the Third United Nations International Conference on the Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy".

An explanatory memorandum, in accordance with rule 20 of the rules of procedure, is attached.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

1. In accordance with General Assembly resolution 1770(XVII) of 29 November 1962, the Secretary-General, with the assistance of the United Nations Scientific Advisory Committee, in co-operation with the International Atomic Energy Agency and in consultation with interested specialized agencies, arranged for the Third International Conference on the Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy to be held in Geneva from 31 August to 9 September 1964. The Third Conference, in line with the provisions of resolution 1770(XVII), was considerably more limited in size and cost than the First and Second Conferences, held in 1955 and 1958, respectively. It was devoted largely, but by no means exclusively, to questions related to nuclear reactors.

2. Following the First Conference, a report was submitted by the Secretary-General to the General Assembly at its tenth session. Similarly, a report on the Second Conference was submitted by the Secretary-General to the General Assembly at its thirteenth session. The Secretary-General, with the assistance of the United Nations Scientific Advisory Committee, proposes to submit a report on the Third Conference to the General Assembly at its nineteenth session.
