SPECIAL TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR TERRITORIES UNDER
PORTUGUESE ADMINISTRATION

Financial implications of draft resolution IV submitted
by the Fourth Committee in document A/5673

Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Raouf BOUDJAKDJI (Algeria)

1. In accordance with rule 154 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, the Fifth Committee considered, at its 1057th meeting, on 13 December 1963, the financial implications of a draft resolution submitted by the Fourth Committee on the subject of special training programmes for the indigenous territories under Portuguese administration (A/5673, draft resolution IV).
2. For its consideration of the item, the Committee had before it a report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/1006) indicating that, for the reasons given in paragraphs 7 to 10, a precise estimate of the financial implications could not be submitted at the present time. The Chairman of the Advisory Committee presented orally the report of that Committee.
3. By 65 votes to 1, with 1 abstention, the Fifth Committee decided, on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, to inform the General Assembly that, in the event of the adoption of draft resolution IV contained in document A/5673: (a) the Secretary-General should be requested to make use as fully as possible of the existing United Nations programmes of technical co-operation, in particular, the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance and the Special Fund; and (b) to the extent

that funds might be required for the programme from the regular budget, he should seek the prior concurrence of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions to meet such commitments up to a maximum of \$50,000, under the terms of the resolution relating to unforeseen and extraordinary expenses for the financial year 1964.
