THE POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT
OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA

Note verbale dated 15 October 1963 from the Permanent Representative
of Libya to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Representative of the Kingdom of Libya to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and with reference to the General Assembly's resolution 1761 (XVII), of 7 November 1962, has the honour to inform that the Government of the Kingdom of Libya has taken the following measures in compliance with the above-mentioned resolution:

1. There are no diplomatic relations between the Kingdom of Libya and South Africa, and in no way the Government of Libya will agree on such relations as long as apartheid policies and racial discrimination are not abolished and abandoned.
2. Administrative and legal measures have been taken to ensure that no vessel flying South African flag, or registered under the laws of South Africa, or chartered by South Africa, will be permitted to enter Libyan ports or navigate in Libyan national waters.
3. The same measures were made applicable on all South African aircraft, on scheduled or non-scheduled flights, this ban including, also overflying the Libyan territory.
4. Economic relations with South Africa have been totally severed.
