APPOINTMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF
SUBSIDIARY BODIES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Board of Auditors

Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Vladimír PRUSA (Czechoslovakia)

1. At its 1075th meeting, held on 25 October 1965, the Fifth Committee considered a note by the Secretary-General (A/5954) concerning the vacancy in the membership of the Board of Auditors which will occur as a result of the expiration of the term of office of one of its members on 30 June 1966.
2. The members of the Fifth Committee had previously been invited to make suggestions in regard to the Auditor-General (or officer holding the equivalent title) who might be recommended to the General Assembly for appointment as a member of the Board of Auditors. At the time the matter was considered by the Committee, the Government of Colombia had presented the candidature of its Auditor-General for appointment to the Board of Auditors in respect of the above-mentioned vacancy.
3. To decide on its recommendation to the General Assembly, the Committee voted by secret ballot. The result of the ballot was as follows:

The Auditors-General of two other countries received one vote each.

4. The Auditor-General of Colombia, having received the required majority, was declared recommended for appointment as a member of the Board of Auditors for a three-year term beginning on 1 July 1966.

RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

5. The Fifth Committee therefore recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

Appoints the Auditor-General of Colombia as a member of the Board of Auditors for a three-year term beginning on 1 July 1966.
