- 1. In accordance with rule 154 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, the Fifth Committee considered, at its 1105th meeting on 3 December 1965, the financial implications of the recommendations made by the Special Committee in chapter I, paragraph 109, of its report (A/6000).
- 2. The Committee had before it a note by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/1043) and a report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/6130).

DECISION OF THE COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided to inform the General Assembly as follows: should the Assembly approve the recommendations contained in paragraph 109 of the report of the Special Committee, an additional appropriation of \$130,000 should be made under section 16, Special missions, of the 1966 budget to cover expenses of the Special Committee. Since, however, this provision is of necessity based on certain

broad assumptions, the Secretary-General should be authorized, to the extent that actual requirements might exceed \$130,000, to meet such additional requirements up to a maximum of \$70,000 under the terms of paragraph 1 of the resolution relating to unforeseen and extraordinary expenses for 1966, or a total of \$200,000 for the Special Committee for 1966.
