INCLUSION OF AN ADDITIONAL ITEM IN THE AGENDA
OF THE THIRTEENTH SESSION

ADMISSION OF NEW MEMBERS TO THE UNITED NATIONS

Second Report of the General Committee

1. At its 120th meeting held on 12 December 1958, the General Committee had before it a special report by the Security Council (A/4067) on the question of admission of new Members to the United Nations. The Council reported the adoption by it, on 9 December, of a resolution recommending the admission of the Republic of Guinea to membership (A/4049); see also the letter of application from the Republic of Guinea (A/4048). The Council also reported on its consideration of the question of the admission of the Republic of Korea, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and Viet-Nam.
2. The General Committee decided without discussion to recommend to the General Assembly that it include the item "Admission of new Members to the United Nations" in the agenda of its thirteenth session. The Committee recommends that, notwithstanding the provisions of rule 67 of the rules of procedure, the Assembly proceed to the consideration of the item directly in plenary meeting and that this be done as a matter of priority.
3. The General Committee decided without objection that the item should be considered as item 6 on the agenda of the 788th plenary meeting of the General Assembly.
