
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### Note verbale dated 16 November 2016 from the Permanent Mission of South Sudan to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of South Sudan to the United Nations presents its compliments to Fodé Seck, President of the Security Council for the month of November 2016, and has the honour to forward the Agreement of the Republic of South Sudan to implement the joint Transitional Government of National Unity-Security Council communiqué of 4 September 2016 concerning the deployment of the regional protection force (see annex).

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of South Sudan to the United Nations further seeks your assistance in circulating the aforementioned agreement among the members of the Security Council as a document of the Council.





# Annex to the note verbale dated 16 November 2016 from the Permanent Mission of South Sudan to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

## Agreement for the implementation of the joint Transitional Government of National Unity-United Nations Security Council communiqué of 4 September 2016 (issued on 16 November)

Cognizant of the critical importance of the joint Transitional Government of National Unity-United Nations Security Council communiqué of 4 September 2016 in the achievement of durable peace in the Republic of South Sudan,

Aware of the need for expeditious agreement on the strategies and modalities for the implementation of the contents of said communiqué,

The Transitional Government and the Security Council, having harmonized understanding on the wording of Security Council resolution 2304 (2016), discussed the areas of relevance to unimpeded implementation by the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) of its mandate and further discussed issues related to humanitarian access, the parties now agree as follows:

- 1. A "one-stop shop" will be established within the premises of UNMISS to expedite and ease, inter alia, clearances of flights, clearances of imports (goods and equipment) by customs authorities, the elimination of illegal taxes and fees and the review of modalities to streamline bureaucratic processes that hinder UNMISS operations;
- (a) The Transitional Government technical team agreed to work within the premises of UNMISS to achieve the objectives of the one-stop shop;
- (b) UNMISS will provide detailed information on all imports in advance to allow ample time for clearance procedures within the one-stop shop;
- 2. UNMISS will have planned visits, notification of which will be communicated in advance indicating the date, location and troop type;
- (a) Notwithstanding the freedom of movement of UNMISS, advance written notification, ideally within 72 hours for clearance of convoys and patrols, shall be provided in order for the relevant authorities to clear and communicate to relevant units the intent of UNMISS to conduct aerial or ground surveillance;
- (b) In cases of emergency, UNMISS will communicate to the authorized officer(s), who will in turn deal with the case according to its severity/merits and circumstances;
- (c) Airplane landing clearance during an emergency shall be communicated to the Civil Aviation Authority to coordinate with the security authorities concerned;
- 3. Seven checkpoints have been agreed to be under the jurisdiction of the South Sudan National Police;
- (a) Representatives of the relevant government institutions will support the police force at the checkpoints;

- (b) UNMISS/the regional protection force can only observe government operations at checkpoints as part of its monitoring mandate;
- (c) Modalities for operations at the checkpoints shall be in accordance with procedures of the South Sudan National Police;
- 4. Modalities will be developed for patrols to ensure that they are effective, timely and healthy for the relationships between the parties;
- (a) Inside Juba, UNMISS shall conduct normal patrols at convenient times in coordination with the Joint Operations Centre (UNMISS is represented in the Joint Operations Centre);
- (b) Patrols on the agreed interstate roads (seven arterial routes and four ingress/egress routes) shall be coordinated. The commanders concerned shall finalize the details of the operation in due course;
- 5. Protection will be coordinated for key installations, including schools, hospitals, markets, bridges and United Nations warehouses. The commanders concerned shall work out the final details;
- (a) UNMISS can accompany convoys carrying their supplies in coordination with Transitional Government security;
- 6. A 4,000-member regional protection force will be deployed, including a 2,200-member infantry force from Kenya, Rwanda and Ethiopia;
- (a) A 1,800-member support force is agreed. The United Nations Department of Peacekeeping Operations shall explain the inclusion of non-regional contributing countries;
- (b) The regional protection force shall carry standard "personal weapons". All other weapons and equipment shall be dealt with as agreed in the attached tables for the high-readiness company, the tactical helicopter unit and the infantry force;
- (c) The joint technical working group shall urgently discuss and recommend suitable areas for land to accommodate the regional protection force;

#### 7. Protection of civilians:

- (a) In cases of humanitarian emergency, the Transitional Government and UNMISS shall coordinate on evacuation and take necessary measures to protect civilians;
- (b) In cases of unpredictable situations, including military engagements, that threaten civilians, the national security forces and UNMISS shall coordinate how to combat the threat against civilians;
- 8. Juba International Airport: the Ministry of Transport, the joint technical working group and the Civil Aviation Authority have agreed to have a joint modality for the coordinated protection and security of the airport. The details shall be worked out by the parties, documented and used as a protocol of operation in accordance with Security Council resolution 2304 (2016). As part of this;
  - (a) UNMISS has repaired a generator for electricity supply;

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- (b) UNMISS has provided three modules (prefabricated houses) for office accommodation;
  - (c) UNMISS has trained fire services and will continue to do so;
  - (d) UNMISS has promised to use its assets when and if necessary;
- (e) Ring roads shall be cleared around the perimeter of the airport during the dry season to safeguard the airport;
- (f) The Transitional Government shall host a visit to discuss with the relevant authorities other needs and measures specific to security and protection;
- 9. A non-governmental organizations (NGOs) desk or humanitarian one-stop shop will be established and qualified and competent staff from relevant government institutions, United Nations agencies and NGOs will be deployed to operationalize the NGOs desk or one-stop shop.

- 3. UNMISS intends to sign this document after completing consultations with authorities in New York.
