THE POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT  
OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA

Note by the Secretary-General

1. The General Assembly, in resolution 2202 A (XXI) of 16 December 1966, requested the Secretary-General "to organize as soon as possible, in consultation with the Special Committee on the Policies of Apartheid of the Government of the Republic of South Africa and the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, an international conference or seminar on the problems of apartheid, racial discrimination and colonialism in southern Africa, and to transmit the report of that conference or seminar to the General Assembly at its twenty-second session".
2. Accordingly, the Secretary-General requested the advice of the two Committees concerning the various aspects of the organization of an international conference or seminar.
3. The Secretary-General has now received identical proposals from the two Committees.<sup>1/</sup>
4. The Secretary-General has accepted the proposals of the two Committees and an invitation from the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania and has decided to organize an International Seminar on Apartheid, Racial Discrimination and Colonialism in Southern Africa, from 15 to 28 July 1967 at Dar es Salaam.
