Letter dated 15 May 1985 from the Chairman of the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries

In keeping with the lofty aim of the United Nations to preserve world peace and the Chinese people's fervent opposition to war and their desire to preserve peace, I have the honour to inform you that, on 10 May, following consultations with Chinese political, economic, scientific and technological, religious, educational, press and artistic circles and with trade unions and youth, women's and other mass organizations, the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries, in its capacity as the body responsible for the preparation of activities to be launched in China for the International Year of Peace, established at Beijing the Chinese Organizational Committee for the International Year of Peace; the Committee is composed of 40 persons - leaders of Government and mass organizations and eminent persons from all circles - and will co-ordinate the various activities for the safeguarding of world peace to be launched in China and will maintain contact with the United Nations. Attached herewith are a list of the members of the Chinese Organizational Committee, the programme of activities to be carried out in China for the International Year of Peace and proposals to the United Nations. The office of the Committee has been set up at the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries (cable address: YOUXIE, BEIJING, CHINA).

The preservation of world peace has become the most important and urgent question in contemporary international politics. Thus the proclamation of the International Year of Peace is fully in keeping with the shared hopes of all mankind. It is my deep conviction that, in the course of striving towards the lofty goal of preserving world peace, we will be able to co-operate fully and closely with you.

APPENDIX II

Programme of activities to be held in China for the International Year of Peace and proposals to the United Nations

- I. Programme of activities to be held in China for the International Year of Peace:
 - A mass rally to commemorate the International Year of Peace will be held at Beijing; eminent persons and delegations from all fields will be invited to participate;
 - 2. The Chinese Academy of Social Sciences will conduct a symposium on the preservation of world peace; eminent scholars and persons involved in peace activities will be invited to present papers or give lectures;
 - 3. A major long-distance peace torch relay race will be organized;
 - Major periodicals throughout the country will publish relevant scholarly, literary and artistic essays and pictures;
 - 5. The Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications will issue a series of stamps commemorating the International Year of Peace;
 - 6. The People's Bank of China will issue a set of commemorative coins (one gold and one silver) for the International Year of Peace;
 - The Publications Bureau will issue pamphlets on the International Year of Peace;
 - 8. The Ministry of Culture and artists' associations will be asked to create literary and artistic works and give performances having as their theme the International Year of Peace.
- II. Proposals to the United Nations for launching the International Year of Peace:
 - 1. The United Nations might design an International Year of Peace emblem;
 - 2. A World Peace Year celebration, having as its theme "Peace and the Future", might be held when the General Assembly meets in 1986;
 - 3. The General Assembly might adopt an Appeal for Peace, calling for a halt to all acts of hegemony and wars of aggression, opposition to interference in the internal affairs of other countries and the use of peaceful means to settle international disputes;
 - 4. The United Nations might issue stamps commemorating the International Year of Peace;

5. The United Nations might initiate an International Year of Peace Commemorative Coin Programme, appealing to all States to participate; China would be willing to assume responsibility for minting the commemorative coins of some participating States.
