Note by the Secretary-General

Addendum

- 1. In accordance with relevant Economic and Social Council resolutions and in particular resolution 1986/35 of 23 May 1986, the Commission on Human Rights at its forty-sixth session, is called upon to elect half of the Sub-Commission membership and the corresponding alternates, if any, whose term of office should expire after two years in accordance with the following pattern: three members from African States; three members from Asian States; one member from Eastern European States; three members from Latin American States and three members from Western European and other States.
- 2. The Secretary-General, in document E/CN.4/1990/48 and Add.1-3 informed the Commission of the nominations of candidates and alternates for election to the Sub-Commission received as at 25 January 1990. That document also contained the biographical data of candidates and alternates which had been received.
- 3. On 8 January 1990, the Government of India informed the Secretary-General that it had decided to withdraw the candidature of Mr. Murlidhar Bhandare and to nominate Mr. Rajindar Sachar for election to the Sub-Commission. On 7 February 1990, the Government of Panama informed the Secretary-General that it had decided to withdraw its nominations for election to the Sub-Commission.

- 4. The present document contains the updated list of nominations for membership of the Sub-Commission as at 8 February 1990. Also included is biographical data received since 25 January 1990 (see annex).
- 5. Further communications and nominations will be reproduced in addenda.
