Note verbale dated 30 November 2016 from the Permanent Mission of South Sudan to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of South Sudan to the United Nations presents its compliments to Fodé Seck, President of the Security Council for the month of November 2016, and has the honour to forward the final position of the Republic of South Sudan on the implementation of the joint Transitional Government of National Unity-Security Council communiqué concerning the deployment of the regional protection force (see annex).

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of South Sudan to the United Nations further seeks your assistance in circulating the aforementioned agreement among the members of the Security Council as a document of the Council.

Modalities for the implementation of the joint Transitional Government of National Unity-United Nations Security Council communiqué of 4 September 2016 (issued on 30 November)

Cognizant of the critical importance of the Joint Transitional Government of National Unity-United Nations Security Council communiqué of 4 September 2016 in the achievement of durable peace in the Republic of South Sudan, and recalling the commitment of the Security Council to the sovereignty, freedom and independence of South Sudan,

Aware of the need for expeditious agreement on the strategies and modalities for the implementation of the contents of said communiqué,

The Transitional Government and the Security Council having harmonized understanding on the wording of Security Council resolution [2304 \(2016\)](#), discussed the areas of relevance to the unimpeded implementation by the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) of its mandate and further discussed issues relating to humanitarian access, the parties agree as follows:

1. A “one-stop shop” shall be established within the premises of UNMISS to act as a single entry point to process, expedite and ease tax exemptions and security clearances for all goods and equipment imported by and on behalf of UNMISS, the elimination of illegal taxes and fees and the review of modalities to streamline bureaucratic processes that hinder UNMISS operations;

(a) UNMISS shall provide detailed information of all imports to allow time for necessary procedures within the one-stop shop, and the Transitional Government agrees to work with UNMISS to achieve the objectives of the one-stop shop;

2. On the UNMISS mandate:

(a) Notwithstanding the unrestricted freedom of movement of UNMISS, written notification, ideally within 72 hours, shall be submitted routinely for convoys and patrols so that the relevant authorities can communicate UNMISS intent to local units;

(b) The Transitional Government agrees to planned UNMISS visits, notification of which will be communicated in advance indicating the date, location and troop type;

(c) In case of emergency, UNMISS will notify the authorized officer(s) who will, in turn, deal with the case as quickly as possible according to its severity/merits and circumstances;

(d) Aircraft landing clearance during an emergency shall be communicated to the Civil Aviation Authority to coordinate with the security authorities concerned;

3. On checkpoints and patrols:

(a) The Transitional Government agrees to the establishment of seven checkpoints along the seven arterial routes in and out of Juba, under the jurisdiction of the South Sudan National Police Service;

(b) UNMISS and the regional protection force may observe government operations at checkpoints without prejudice to its mandate in order to facilitate free and safe movement by protecting routes into, out of and around Juba;

(c) In the conduct of routine and discretionary patrolling in Juba, UNMISS shall cooperate and coordinate with the Transitional Government, including through the Joint Operations Centre to which UNMISS has assigned liaison officers;

4. On the protection of key facilities/installations and Juba International Airport:

(a) The Transitional Government and UNMISS shall conduct coordinated protection of agreed installations and facilities essential to the well-being of the people of Juba. The joint technical working group is to continue to develop the requisite practical arrangements, involving all stakeholders;

(b) The Transitional Government agrees to coordinated protection of Juba International Airport. A joint security assessment shall be conducted to determine the optimal coordinated protection in accordance with Security Council resolution [2304 \(2016\)](#);

(c) It is agreed that UNMISS will undertake to provide a rough terrain patrol track around the airport perimeter. UNMISS shall continue to train the fire service, and the Transitional Government agrees to the use by UNMISS of its assets located at the airfield to provide fire and other emergency support in the event of a crisis;

5. On the regional protection force:

(a) The Transitional Government agrees to the deployment of 4,000 regional protection forces, comprising approximately 2,200 from three troop-contributing countries (Ethiopia, Kenya and Rwanda) and approximately 1,800 enablers;

(b) The regional protection force shall carry standard equipment and weapons, the list of which shall be submitted according to current UNMISS procedures. The list of troops contributing contingent-owned equipment being deployed as part of the force shall be forwarded to the Transitional Government for expeditious clearance once confirmed by the Headquarters and the contributing nation;

(c) The Transitional Government agrees to provide land for the regional protection force and has directed the Government of Jubek State to allow UNMISS to carry out site visits at the three potential force base locations and to engage UNMISS on its proposal for a fourth site in or around Juba north of Juba city;

6. On unhindered and unrestricted humanitarian assistance, the Transitional Government agrees to the establishment of a non-governmental organizations (NGOs) desk or humanitarian one-stop shop to which qualified and competent staff from the relevant government institutions, United Nations agencies and NGOs shall be deployed in order to achieve the objectives of Presidential Order No. 23/2016. The Transitional Government will ensure that the intentions and proposals for

unhindered and unrestricted humanitarian assistance are implemented without further impediments.
