Note by the Secretary-General

Addendum

- 1. In accordance with relevant Economic and Social Council resolutions and in particular resolution 1986/35 of 23 May 1986, the Commission on Human Rights, at its forty-sixth session, is called upon to elect half of the Sub-Commission membership and the corresponding alternates, if any, whose term of office should expire after two years in accordance with the following pattern: three members from African States; three members from Asian States; one member from Eastern European States; three members from Latin American States and three members from Western European and other States.
- 2. The Secretary-General, in document E/CN.4/1990/48 and Add.1 and 2, informed the Commission of the nominations of candidates and alternates for election to the Sub-Commission received as at 6 December 1989. That document also contained the biographical data on candidates and alternates which had been received.
- 3. Additional nominations and biographical data have been received since 6 December 1989. The present document contains the updated list of nominations for membership of the Sub-Commission as at 25 January 1990. Also included are biographical data not reproduced in document E/CN.4/1990/48 and Add.1 and 2 and/or received since 6 December 1989 (see annex).
- 4. Further communications and nominations will be reproduced in addenda.
