Letter dated 21 September 1968, addressed to the Secretary-General
by the President of the General Assembly

I should like to refer to resolution 2349 (XXII) adopted by the General Assembly at its 1641st plenary meeting on 19 December 1967 under agenda item 68 entitled "Question of the consolidation and integration of the special educational and training programmes for South West Africa, the special training programme for Territories under Portuguese administration and the educational and training programme for South Africans".

In operative paragraph 6 of the resolution, the General Assembly requested the President to nominate seven Member States, each of which should appoint a representative to serve on a committee which would advise the Secretary-General on the granting of subventions to educational and training institutions in Africa.

It was my hope to be able to announce the composition of the committee before the closing of the session. Since, however, this has not been possible despite my continued consultations with delegations, it might be advisable to request the General Assembly to re-examine this matter during its twenty-third session.

I should be grateful if you would kindly have this letter circulated to the Members of the General Assembly.
