Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 1627th meeting, on 13 December 1973, the Fifth Committee, in compliance with the provisions of rule 155 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/1586) on the administrative and financial implications of draft resolution C recommended by the Special Political Committee in part II of its report (A/9276/Add.1, para. 15).
2. Under the terms of the draft resolution, the General Assembly would decide to increase the membership of the United Nations Scientific Committee on the Effects of Atomic Radiation to a maximum of 20 members.
3. In his statement (A/C.5/1586), the Secretary-General indicated that an additional appropriation of \$14,000 would be required to cover the travel and subsistence costs of the additional five members.
4. In an oral report, the Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions indicated that the Advisory Committee concurred in the Secretary-General's estimate.

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

5. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution C recommended by the Special Political Committee in part II of its report (A/9276/Add.1, para. 15), an additional appropriation of \$14,000 would be required under section 1 of the programme budget for the biennium 1974-1975.
