Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 1288th meeting, held on 16 December 1968, the Fifth Committee, in compliance with rule 154 of the rules of procedure, considered a report by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/1212) on the administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution contained in the report of the Sixth Committee (A/7402, para.31) on the report of the Special Committee on the Question of Defining Aggression. The Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions made an oral statement.
2. In terms of the draft resolution, the Special Committee on the Question of Defining Aggression would be required to resume in 1969 its work in accordance with General Assembly resolution 2330 (XXII). The Secretary-General estimated at \$25,600 the additional costs of a five-week session in New York during the period 24 February to 28 March 1969. The Advisory Committee agreed that an additional provision in this amount would be required.
3. Accordingly, the Fifth Committee decided to advise the General Assembly that the adoption of the draft resolution would necessitate an additional appropriation in the amount of \$25,600 under section 2 for 1969.
