SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/21100 of 24 January 1990 and S/21100/Add.2 of 2 February 1990.

During the week ending 10 February 1990, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Letter dated 2 February 1990 from the Permanent Representative of Cuba to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

In a letter dated 2 February 1990 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/21120), the Permanent Representative of Cuba to the United Nations requested that a meeting of the Security Council be convened in order to consider the harassment of and armed attack on a Cuban merchant ship in the Gulf of Mexico by a vessel of the Coast Guard of the Government of the United States of America.

The Security Council met to consider the item at its 2907th meeting, held on 9 February 1990 on the basis of the above request.

The President of the Security Council (Cuba) informed members of his decision to have resort to rule 20 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Council and to yield the presidential chair, for the purpose of the consideration of the item presently on the Council's agenda, to the representative of the next member in English alphabetical order (Democratic Yemen). The representative of Democratic Yemen took the presidential chair.
