## Statement dated 11 February 1990 by the spokesman for the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of Algeria

It is with deep satisfaction that Algeria welcomes the return to freedom of the great African patriot Nelson Mandela. This historic event is a stunning victory for the hero Mandela who, during 28 years of imprisonment, unceasingly waged his struggle against apartheid with unwavering determination.
