Letter from the Secretary of the People's Committee of the People's Bureau for Foreign Liaison of the Libyan Arab

Jamahiriya addressed to the Secretary-General

I should like to call attention to the dangers arising from the flagrant violations of the racist régime in Pretoria and its savage and repeated acts of aggression against the States of southern Africa, particularly the attacks launched from time to time by the racist régime against Angola.

Such a barbaric course of action constitutes a flagrant violation of the provisions of the Charter of the United Nations and of all international covenants and resolutions, particularly Security Council resolutions condemning such acts of aggression and calling for respect for the sovereignty and dignity of Member States.

In calling your esteemed attention and that of the international community to such violations, I should be grateful if you would have this letter circulated as an official document of the General Assembly, under items 34 and 35 of the preliminary list, and of the Security Council.
