I, PETER GORDON LIVINGSTONE, Director-General of Health and Medical Services for the State of Queensland, by and with the approval of the Deputy Governer in Council and in pursuance of the provisions of the Health Act 1937-1981, do hereby make the following amendments to "The Poisons Regulations of 1973".

## [....]

7. Schedule 8 is amended by the insertion in their appropriate place of the following expressions:

"1-1-(2-Thienyl) cyclohexyl piperidine (TCP). 1-(1-Phenylcyclohexyl) pyrrolidine (PHP or PCPY). N-Ethyl-1-phencyclohexylamine (PCE). Mecloqualone 3-(0-Chlorophenyl)-2-methyl-4-(3h) quinazolinone.".
