ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL PROVISIONS IN RESPECT OF ERITREA, ARISING OUT OF PARAGRAPH 19 OF ANNEX XIV OF THE PEACE TREATY WITH ITAXY

Explanatory memoranium on item 7 on the supplementary list

The disposal of the former Italian colony of Eritrea in accordance with the Treaty of Peace with Italy was effected in the political sense by the General Assembly resolution 390 (V) of 2 December 1950, but it will be recalled that, in accordance with paragraph 19 of Annex KIV of the Treaty of Peace with Italy, economic and financial provisions (regarding the disposal of the relevant Italian economic and financial interests) were to form part of the general disposal of the former Italian colonies. It is considered therefore that a complementary resolution should now be adopted, setting out the economic and financial provisions which are required, in the same way as a complementary resolution, 388 (V), was passed regarding Libya on 15 December 1950.

Attention is invited to document A/AC.38/SC.1/R.1 of 23 October 1950 (Notes and documentation prepared by the Secretariat regarding economic and financial provisions in relation to the former Italian colonies) and to resolution 388 (V) of 15 December 1950, read in conjunction with document A/1726 of 14 December 1950.

His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom are at present actively considering possible recommendations to the General Assembly on this question as it affects Eritrea, and they propose to submit a draft resolution in the near future after consultation with the Government of Ethiopia (as the future Federal Government) and the Government of Italy.
