Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 27th and 28th meetings, on 10 and 31 March 2017, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/71/L.58 (A/C.5/71/19). At the 27th meeting, the Chair of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions introduced the related report of that Committee (A/71/827). The draft decision submitted by the Chair following informal consultations coordinated by the representative of Pakistan (A/C.5/71/L.26) was before the Committee (see para. 3).

2. The statements and comments made in the course of the Fifth Committee's consideration of this question are reflected in the relevant summary records.¹

Decision of the Fifth Committee

3. The Fifth Committee, having considered the statement of programme budget implications submitted by the Secretary-General² and the related report of the

Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,³ decides to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/71/L.58, an additional appropriation of \$975,700 would be required, including \$417,400 under section 1, Overall policymaking, direction and coordination; \$160,200 under section 2, General Assembly and Economic and Social Council affairs and conference management; \$79,000 under section 9, Economic and social affairs; \$42,100 under section 16, International drug control, crime and terrorism prevention and criminal justice; \$97,100 under section 18, Economic and social development in Africa; \$71,200 under section 21, Economic and social development in Latin America and the Caribbean; \$52,000 under section 22, Economic and social development in Western Asia; and \$8,400 under section 28, Public information, of the programme budget for the biennium 2016-2017, representing a charge against the contingency fund.
