LETTER DATED 24 JANUARY 1990 FROM THE MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS
OF NICARAGUA ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

I have the honour to write to you again expressing my Government's deep concern at the increase in military actions carried out on the ground and from the air against Nicaragua. These actions have caused considerable suffering and tension among the civilian population and serious damage to our already weakened economy. Such actions, launched from outside the national territory, are also a serious violation of my country's sovereignty and territorial integrity and of the commitments entered into by the Central American Presidents in the context of the peace process initiated at Esquipulas.

In this context, the position taken by the United States Government and the contras with regard to the electoral process is particularly disturbing. In October 1989, the contras prevented a considerable number of Nicaraguans from registering to vote in the elections. Since late October, murders of electoral activists of the Frente Sandinista de Liberación Nacional (FSLN) and acts of intimidation against the civilian population have increased in certain areas of the country.

The irregular units have their main operational and logistical bases in Honduran territory, where they have modern communications equipment and logistical support provided by the United States Government.

My Government therefore holds the United States Government responsible for this campaign against the electoral process, which includes the attempt to assassinate the President of the Republic and FSLN presidential candidate on 21 January in the Quilalí area.

I am attaching a document listing the main actions carried out by the $\underline{\text{contras}}$ during the period in question.

On the basis of the mandate entrusted to ONUCA of conducting on-site verification of the cessation of aid to irregular forces and insurrectionist movements and the non-use of the territory of one State for attacks on other States, my Government requests that ONUCA investigate and prevent such incidents.

These incidents are further proof that the <u>contra</u> demobilization process must be carried out immediately and that the mandate of ONUCA must be broadened to enable it to participate in the demobilization of these irregular forces, in accordance with the agreements reached by the Central American Presidents at the summit meetings at Tela, Honduras, and San Isidro de Coronado, Costa Rica.

It is also extremely important, as I told you in my note of 11 January 1990, that CIAV begin to perform its functions immediately by setting up follow-up offices; disseminating information on the content of the Joint Plan, the progress

made in implementing it and the guarantees offered by my Government; taking a headcount of contra troops and making an inventory of their weapons; setting up reception centres; creating temporary residence areas; meeting the basic needs of repatriated persons on their arrival; etc.

21 January

An unknown number of <u>contras</u> attempted to ambus; the FSLN election motorcade headed by President Daniel Ortega at Buena Vista, an area near Quilalí, in the North Atlantic Autonomous Region. The ambush did not take place because army and Ministry of the Interior troops intercepted contra communications ahead of time.

22 January

 Contra forces who had entered the country from Honduran territory kidnapped
 80 peasant coffee cutters from the Santa Teresa estate, 30 kilometres north of Jinotega.
