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UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL AND TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR SOUTHERN AFRICA

Report of the Secretary-General

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I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The United Nations Educational and Training Programme for Southern Africa (UNETPSA) was established by the General Assembly in its resolution 2349 (XXII) of 19 December 1967 by integrating earlier special programmes to assist persons from Namibia, South Africa, Southern Rhodesia and Territories under the Portuguese administration in Africa. Following the accession to independence of the Territories formerly under Portuguese administration, the Programme now grants scholarships only to inhabitants of Namibia, South Africa and Southern Rhodesia. Existing scholarships for inhabitants of other territories are continued until the completion of courses for which they have been granted. The Programme is financed from a trust fund made up of voluntary contributions by States, organizations and individuals. It is administered by the Secretary-General in consultation with the Advisory Committee on the United Nations Educational and Training Programme for Southern Africa which was established by General Assembly resolution 2431 (XXIII) of 18 December 1968.
- In its resolution 33/42 of 13 December 1978, the General Assembly reaffirmed that the Programme had been a significant and worthwhile effort of the international community to assist the people of southern Africa and that its continuation and expansion during this crucial period were essential. It recognized that, because of the continuing influx of student refugees from southern Africa into neighbouring States and the continued rise in the cost of educational and training awards, additional funds were essential if the Programme was to continue in operation at a satisfactory level. It expressed its appreciation to all those who have made voluntary contributions to the Programme and appealed once again to all States, organizations and individuals to make generous contributions to the Programme in order to ensure its continuation and expansion. It requested the Secretary-General, in consultation with the Advisory Committee on UNETPSA, to arrange for an evaluation of the Programme in the light of developments in southern Africa since the last evaluation in 1975. It also decided to enlarge the composition of the Advisory Committee by the addition of up to six members, on the basis of consultations by the Secretary-General with regional groups. 1/
- 3. The present report covers the period from 1 November 1978 to 30 September 1979.
- 4. Further, by resolution 33/164 of 20 December 1978 entitled "Assistance to South African student refugees", the General Assembly, aware that the continued influx of South African student refugees fleeing from repressive policies continued to cause pressure on the available educational and other facilities in neighbouring countries offering asylum to those students, commended the Secretary-General and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) for their efforts to organize programmes of assistance to South African student refugees in the host countries. It requested all agencies and programmes of the United Nations system to continue assisting the UNHCR in carrying out the humanitarian functions entrusted to him.

III. AWARDS OF SCHOLARSHIPS

- 9. The increase in contributions and pledges in 1979 enabled the Programme to finance the renewal of 1,151 scholarships and to grant 109 new awards. The number of new awards was considerably less than in the previous year because of the larger number of renewals of scholarships and the substantial increase in individual scholarship costs.
- 10. The pattern of the development of the Programme since 1.968/69 may be seen from the table below:

With the increase in applications and a decrease in the number of new awards, the Programme was able to assist a considerably smaller percentage of young well-qualified candidates to begin their career studies at the university or equivalent level. Further details on applications and awards are given in annex I; details on countries and fields of study are found in annex II.

13. Fifty-one per cent of the scholarship holders in 1978/79 attended institutions in Africa; another 9 per cent attended institutions in developing countries in Asia, particularly in India. Owing to the continued limitation on the intake of foreign students at many African institutions as a result of full utilization of

their facilities, as well as the need for training in fields not readily available in Africa, it has been necessary to increase the number of scholarships for study in countries outside of Africa. The great majority of new awards outside of Africa were to candidates applying from North America and Europe. About 25 per cent of awards were for study in North America and another 15 per cent for study in Europe.

- 14. The number of scholarship holders pursuing post-graduate studies continued to increase. From 126 in 1976/77 the number rose to 210 in 1977/78 and 224 in 1978/79. Of the latter, 40 were enrolled in institutions in Africa and Asia. It is the policy of the Programme to grant awards for post-graduate studies to highly qualified students in fields of study relevant to the manpower needs of the Territory concerned.
- 15. The Programme has continued to give special attention to requests for assistance received from women candidates and the number of new awards to women has steadily increased. Thirty-three per cent of the new awards for 1978/79 were granted to women as compared to 30 per cent for 1977/78.
- 16. The Programme continued to give special attention to the educational needs of young refugee students who have applied for assistance from the countries neighbouring South Africa and Southern Rhodesia. Close liaison was maintained with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), the International University Exchange Fund, the Commonwealth Secretariat, the World University Service, the African-American Institute and other scholarship-granting agencies in order to grant as many scholarships to these students as possible from the combined resources of the sponsoring agencies.
- 17. The Programme also continued to give special consideration to the needs of Namibian candidates, in the light of the recommendation of the Advisory Committee that the Programme should make any necessary adaptations to meet their special educational needs. In consultation with the United Nations Commissioner for Namibia, the Programme approved awards for 10 Namibians to undertake training for the Certificate of Library Studies in Zambia.
 - IV. DEVELOPMENTS CONCERNING THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAMME
- 18. The administration of the Programme has continued on the lines indicated in the last report (A/33/297).
- 19. The Programme has continued to maintain close liaison with UNDP, the specialized agencies of the United Nations, and Bureau of Placement and Education of the Organization of African Unity (OAU), as well as other organizations providing scholarships to southern Africans. It continued to encourage the establishment of Joint Scholarship Committees, Consultative Committees and Counselling Services with the participation of host Governments and scholarship giving agencies in countries where there are a substantial number of scholarship holders. It is represented, through the local UNDP offices, in joint scholarship committees which were established in Liberia and Swaziland in April 1979. These committees have served as focal points for the co-ordination of requests of

students in need of educational assistance, for the identification of students eligible for sponsorship, for the regulation of student alloances and entitlements, and for the provision of counselling services.

- 20. Frequent meetings were held with UNHCR on the co-ordination of assistance to southern African refugees, in pursuance of the standing agreement between UNHCR and the Programme, whereby UNHCR assumes responsibility for requests from southern African students through the first level of secondary education while the Programme is responsible for requests for study at the senior secondary level and above. Advance information from UNHCR on refugee students nearing completion of the first level of secondary education has enabled the Programme to plan for assistance to these students within the annual work plan. In addition, arrangements continued to be made with UNHCR for co-ordinated assistance to groups of refugee students for study in institutions in Africa and Asia, as well as for training in Europe in specialized fields.
- 21. Consultations were held with the Commonwealth Secretariat on assistance to Southern Rhodesian student refugees in the States bordering Southern Rhodesia. Through co-ordinated efforts a number of students were provided scholarships to enable them to complete their university studies. Arrangements were made through the UNDP offices in Africa and India to prevent any duplication of scholarship awards by the Programme and the Commonwealth Secretariat. Steps have also been taken towards ending discrepancies in allowances.
- 22. The Programme was represented at the Conference on the Situation of Refugees in Africa, held in Arusha, United Republic of Tanzania, from 7 to 17 May 1979, under the sponsorship of the Organization of African Unity, the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. It has taken the relevant conclusions of the Conference into account in its operations.

V. WORK OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

- 23. In pursuance of the provisions of General Assembly resolution 33/42, the Secretary-General appointed six new members to the Advisory Committee on the United Nations Educational and Training Programme for southern Africa. It is now composed of the representatives of the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Canada, Denmark, India, Japan, Liberia, Nigeria, Norway, the United Republic of Tanzania, the United States of America, Venezuela, Zaire and Zambia. Representatives of the United Nations Council for Namibia, the Special Committee against Apartheid, the Organization of African Unity and the Commonwealth Secretariat, as well as the representatives of Botswana, Lesotho and Swaziland, attend its meetings in an observer capacity.
- 24. Mr. William H. Barton of Canada continued during the period under review as Chairman of the Advisory Committee.
- 25. The Committee devoted special attention during the year to the promoting of voluntary contributions in order to enable the Programme to continue in operation at a satisfactory level in the context of increasing applications and rising costs of scholarships.

26. It also held preliminary consultations on a new evaluation of the Programme, as provided in General Assembly resolution 33/42. In view of the unavoidable delay in the enlargement of the Advisory Committee and having regard to other factors, it considered that the evaluation might best be undertaken in 1980 after full preparation.

VI. CONCLUSION

- 27. The General Assembly has repeatedly recognized that the Programme has been a significant and worth-while effort of the international community, and that its continuation and expansion are desirable. It has enjoyed overwhelming support from States, and voluntary contributions to the Programme have steadily increased, reflecting growing international concern for the education and training of the indigenous people of Namibia, South Africa and Southern Rhodesia in order to enable them to contribute to the development of their countries. The increase of contributions in the past year, however, has not been proportionate to the increase in the cost of scholarships.
- 28. The Secretary-General hopes that, in view of the continued outflow of young refugees from southern Africa, there will be a substantial increase in contributions to the Programme in 1980 so that it can provide adequate educational assistance to the nationals of Namibia, South Africa and Southern Rhodesia in this critical period.
- 29. In connexion with the evaluation of the Programme, as requested in General Assembly resolution 33/42, the Secretary-General draws attention to the observations of the Advisory Committee (para. 26 above) and suggests that the Assembly might wish to consider provision for an evaluation in 1980.
- 30. The Secretary-General wishes again to express his deep appreciation to those States which have manifested their interest in the Programme by making voluntary contributions and offers of scholarships, or by providing places in educational institutions.
- 31. He wishes to express his gratitude to the Administrative Secretary-General of OAU, the Administrator of UNDP, UNHCR and the executive heads of the specialized agencies for their co-operation. He also wishes to acknowledge the contribution of educational institutions, particularly in Africa, and of other organizations which have co-operated with the Programme.
- 32. Finally, he wishes to thank the Advisory Committee for its valuable advice and assistance in the administration and development of the Programme.
