SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF  
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE  
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/21100 of 24 January 1990, S/21100/Add.2 of 2 February 1990 and S/21100/Add.5 of 16 February 1990.

During the week ending 31 March 1990, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The Security Council continued its consideration of the item at its 2912th, 2914th and 2915th meetings, between 27 and 30 March 1990. In the course of the meetings, in addition to the representatives previously invited, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Afghanistan, Algeria, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Egypt, India, Indonesia, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Morocco, Nicaragua, Pakistan, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, the Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, the United Republic of Tanzania, Yemen and Yugoslavia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

At the 2912th meeting, on 27 March 1990, in response to the request dated 23 March 1990 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Saudi Arabia to the United Nations (S/21203), the Security Council extended an invitation under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Engin A. Ansay.

Central America: efforts towards peace (see S/20370/Add.29 and S/20370/Add.44)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 2913th meeting, on 27 March 1990, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Observer Group in Central America (S/21194).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/21207), which had been prepared in the course of the Council's consultations.

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (S/21207), and adopted it unanimously as resolution 650 (1990).

Resolution 650 (1990) reads as follows:

The Security Council,

Recalling its resolutions 637 (1989) of 27 July 1989 and 644 (1989) of 7 November 1989,

Reiterating its support for the Central American Peace Process and commending the efforts made by the Central American Presidents represented by the agreements they have concluded,

Urging all Parties to comply with their undertakings under the above-mentioned agreements, including in particular the commitments relating to regional security, and reiterating its full support of the Secretary-General's mission of good offices in the region,

Noting with appreciation the efforts undertaken to date by the Secretary-General in support of the Central American peace process, including his continuing efforts to promote voluntary demobilization, resettlement and repatriation as reflected in his report to the Security Council of 15 March 1990 (S/21194),

1. Approves the above-mentioned report (S/21194);
2. Decides to authorize, on a contingency basis in accordance with the above-mentioned report, an enlargement of the mandate of the United Nations Observer Group in Central America (ONUCA) and the addition of armed personnel to its strength in order to enable it to play a part in the voluntary demobilization of the members of the Nicaraguan resistance;
3. Requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council fully informed of further developments regarding the implementation of this resolution.

The situation between Iran and Iraq (see S/13737/Add.38, S/13737/Add.39, S/13737/Add.41, S/13737/Add.42, S/13737/Add.43, S/14840/Add.28, S/14840/Add.40, S/15560/Add.44, S/16270/Add.12, S/16880/Add.9, S/16880/Add.16, S/17725/Add.7, S/17725/Add.8, S/17725/Add.11, S/17725/Add.39, S/17725/Add.40, S/17725/Add.51, S/18570/Add.29, S/18570/Add.51, S/19420/Add.1, S/19420/Add.19, S/19420/Add.32, S/19420/Add.34, S/20370/Add.5, S/20370/Add.38 and S/21100/Add.8)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 2916th meeting, on 29 March 1990, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group, covering the period 23 September 1989 to 22 March 1990 (S/21200).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/21217), which had been prepared in the course of the Council's consultations.

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (S/21217), and adopted it unanimously as resolution 651 (1990).

Resolution 651 (1990) reads as follows:

The Security Council,

Recalling its resolutions 598 (1987) of 20 July 1987, 619 (1988) of 9 August 1988, 631 (1989) of 8 February 1989 and 642 (1989) of 29 September 1989,

Having considered the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group of 22 March 1990, 1/ and taking note of the observations expressed therein,

Decides:

(a) To call once again upon the parties concerned to implement immediately Security Council resolution 598 (1987);

(b) To extend the mandate of the United Nations Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group for a further period of six months, that is, until 30 September 1990;

(c) To request the Secretary-General to submit, at the end of this period, a report on the developments in the situation and the measures taken to implement Security Council resolution 598 (1987).
