STUDY ON THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN DISARMAMENT AND DEVELOPMENT

Canada, Egypt, France, Germany, Federal Republic of, India, Jamaica, Japan, Mexico, Netherlands, Norway, Pakistan, Philippines, Romania, Senegal, Sri Lanka, Sweden and Venezuela: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Recalling the provisions contained in paragraphs 94 and 95 of the Final Document of its tenth special session, about the relationship between disarmament and development,

Recalling further its resolution 33/71 M of 14 December 1978, in which it took note of the organizational report of the group of governmental experts appointed by the Secretary-General to assist him with the study on the relationship between disarmament and development, and its reclution 33/71 I of the same date in which it requested the Secretary-General to transmit to the said group, for its consideration, the proposal to establish an international disarmament fund for development,

Re-emphasizing that one of the principal aims of this study should be to produce results that could effectively guide the formulation of practical measures,

- 1. Takes note of the interim report of the Secretary-General with respect to the above-mentioned study;
- 2. Requests the Secretary-General to take appropriate action to provide the resources and expertise necessary to successfully complete the study in accordance with paragraph 23 of the interim report;

- 3. Appeals to Governments to make available data and information relevant to a meaningful completion of the above-mentioned study;
- Decides to include in the provisional agenda of its thirty-sixth session an item entitled "Final report of the Secretary-General with respect to the study on the relationship between disarmament and development".
