## India: draft resolution\*

Report of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development on its fifth session - financial aspects

## The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolutions 3201 (S-VI) and 3202 (S-VI) of 1 May 1974, containing the Declaration and the Programme of Action on the Establishment of a New International Economic Order, resolution 3281 (XXIX) of 12 December 1974, containing the Charter of Economic Rights and Duties of States, and resolution 3362 (S-VII) of 16 September 1975, entitled "Development and international economic co-operation",

Recalling further its resolution 33/154 of 20 December 1978 in which it, inter alia, urged Member States to take the necessary steps with a view to ensuring satisfactory results from the fifth session of the Conference and to work towards agreement on action-oriented and other decisions at that session that would contribute effectively to the establishment of the New International Economic Order,

Reaffirming the important role of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development in the realization of the objectives of Assembly resolutions 3201 (S-VI), 3202 (S-VI), 3362 (S-VII) and 32/197 of 20 December 1977,

1. <u>Emphasizes</u> the need for the provision of adequate financial resources for the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development to implement the relevant resolutions and decisions of the fifth session of the Conference and of the Trade and Development Board;
