Administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.2/3^L/L.7^L/Rev.2

<u>Statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance</u> with rule 153 of the rules of procedure

1. Under the terms of the draft resolution the Secretary-General would be requested:

(a) To mobilize the financial, technical and economic assistance of the international community, in particular that of the developed countries and the appropriate organizations of the United Mations system, with a view to helping to meet the short-term and long-term development needs of Saint Lucia and St. Vincent.

(b) To present the General Assembly with an analytical report on the implementation of the present resolution at its thirty-fifth session.

2. In response to the requests described in paragraph 1 above the Secretarv-General would need to send a consulting mission. The mission, to be undertaken in 1980, would be of a duration of 20 days and composed of three persons (USC/ASG, Consultant and one Frofessional). The estimated costs are as follows:
