APPOINTMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN SUBSIDIARY ORGANS

CONFIRMATION OF THE APPOINTMENT OF THREE MEMBERS  
OF THE INVESTMENTS COMMITTEE

Note by the Secretary-General

1. In accordance with the provisions of article 20 of the regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund, the Secretary-General, after consultation with the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, submits for confirmation by the General Assembly the following appointments as members of the United Nations Investments Committee for three-year terms, beginning 1 January 1980: Mr. Aloysio de Andrade Faria (reappointment), Mr. Braj Kumar Mehru (reappointment) and Mr. Stanislaw Raczkowski (reappointment).
2. The advice of the Investments Committee has been invaluable to the Secretary-General and his predecessors in carrying out their responsibilities for the investment of the assets of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund. The Secretary-General very much appreciates their willingness to continue to carry on this important international public service. As the Secretary-General has stated to the Joint Staff Pension Board and the Advisory Committee, he also draws upon such specialized expertise as may be advisable, bearing in mind the investments of the Fund.
3. In order to provide for continuity in the membership of the Investments Committee, the terms of the members have been staggered. If the General Assembly confirms the proposed appointments, the United Nations Investments Committee would consist of the following members: Mr. Hamzah Merghani, Mr. David Montagu and Mr. Yves Oltramare, whose terms of office expire on 31 December 1980; Mr. R. Manning Brown, Mr. Jean Guyot and Mr. Toshio Shishido, whose terms of office expire on 31 December 1981; Mr. Aloysio de Andrade Faria, Mr. Braj Kumar Mehru and Mr. Stanislaw Raczkowski, whose terms of office expire on 31 December 1982.
