Administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution

Statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance
with rule 153 of the rules of procedure

1. The Second Committee at its 54th meeting on 1 December 1979 adopted the draft resolution contained in document A/C.2/34/L.74/Rev.2 as orally amended.
2. Under the terms of the draft resolution the Secretary-General would be requested:

(a) To mobilize the financial, technical and economic assistance of the international community, in particular that of the developed countries and the appropriate organizations of the United Nations system, with a view to helping to meet the short-term and long-term development needs of Saint Lucia and St. Vincent;

(b) To present the General Assembly with an analytical report on the implementation of the present resolution at its thirty-fifth session.

3. In response to the requests described in paragraph 1 above the Secretary-General would need to send a consulting mission. The mission, to be undertaken in 1980, would be of a duration of 20 days and composed of three persons (USG/ASG, Consultant and one Professional). The estimated costs are as follows:

4. Therefore, in the event of the adoption by the General Assembly of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.2/34/L.74/Rev.2, additional expenditures of \$14,400 would be made in the 1980-1981 programme budget for which an additional appropriation of \$14,400 is requested under section 15 of the programme budget.
