LETTER DATED 24 AUGUST 1990 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF
YUGOSLAVIA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF
THE SECURITY COUNCIL

In connection with my intervention with you of 20 August 1990 and with reference to Article 50 of the Charter of the United Nations, I have the honour to draw your attention to the reply of the Yugoslav Government to the Secretary-General's note SCPC/7/90/1 of 8 August 1990 concerning the implementation of United Nations Security Council resolution 661 (1990), contained in the note of the Federal Secretary for Foreign Affairs of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia to the Secretary-General of 23 August 1990.

The reply of the Yugoslav Government, dealing with the measures that Yugoslavia has undertaken to carry out a full and strict implementation of the said resolution, also specifies in its third part the difficult consequences that compliance with that resolution will have for the Yugoslav economy.

I would appreciate it very much if you could circulate the present letter to the members of the Security Council and have it considered in accordance with Article 50 of the Charter by the Security Council Committee established by resolution 661 (1990).

Enclosed herewith is the text of the reply of the Yugoslav Government sent to the Secretary-General on 23 August 1990. 1/
