South Africa: draft resolution

The Security Council,

Having considered the request by the Permanent Representative of Angola to the United Nations contained in document S/17510,

Gravely concerned at the escalation of conflict and the worsening situation developing in Angola,

<u>Convinced</u> that the unwarranted presence of foreign forces in Angola seriously impedes the development of a process of national reconciliation in that country,

<u>Conscious</u> of the need and desire of the Angolan people to determine their own tuture free from any foreign interference and in an atmosphere of peace and tranguillity,

1. Demands that all foreign military forces be withdrawn forthwith and unconditionally from the tetritory of Angola;

2. <u>Calls upon all States scrupulously to respect the sovereignty and</u> territorial integrity of Angola;

3. <u>Requests</u> the various factions within Angola to settle their differences through a process of peaceful negotiation and in a spirit of national reconciliation;

4. <u>Requests</u> Member States to retrain from intervening in the domestic attairs of Angola so that self-determination can at last be achieved in that country;

5. Decides to remain seized of the matter.
