Message dated 24 October 1985 from the participants at the solemn meeting of the representatives of Ulan Bator and the public organizations of the Mongolian People's Republic devoted to the fortieth anniversary of the United Nations, addressed to the President of the fortieth session of the General Assembly and the Secretary-General

We, the representatives of broad sections of the public of the Mongolian People's Republic, gathered at a solemn meeting devoted to the fortieth anniversary of the founding of the United Nations, send cordial greetings and best wishes to you and, through you, to the participants in the commemorative fortieth session of the General Assembly.

The United Nations, created as a result of the great victory of the peace-loving forces over fascism and militarism, reflected in its Charter the determination of the peoples "to save succeeding generations from the scourge of war" and to live in peace and harmony.

The public of the Mongolian People's Republic attaches great importance to this prestigious Organization as a major instrument for maintaining international peace and strengthening co-operation among States.
